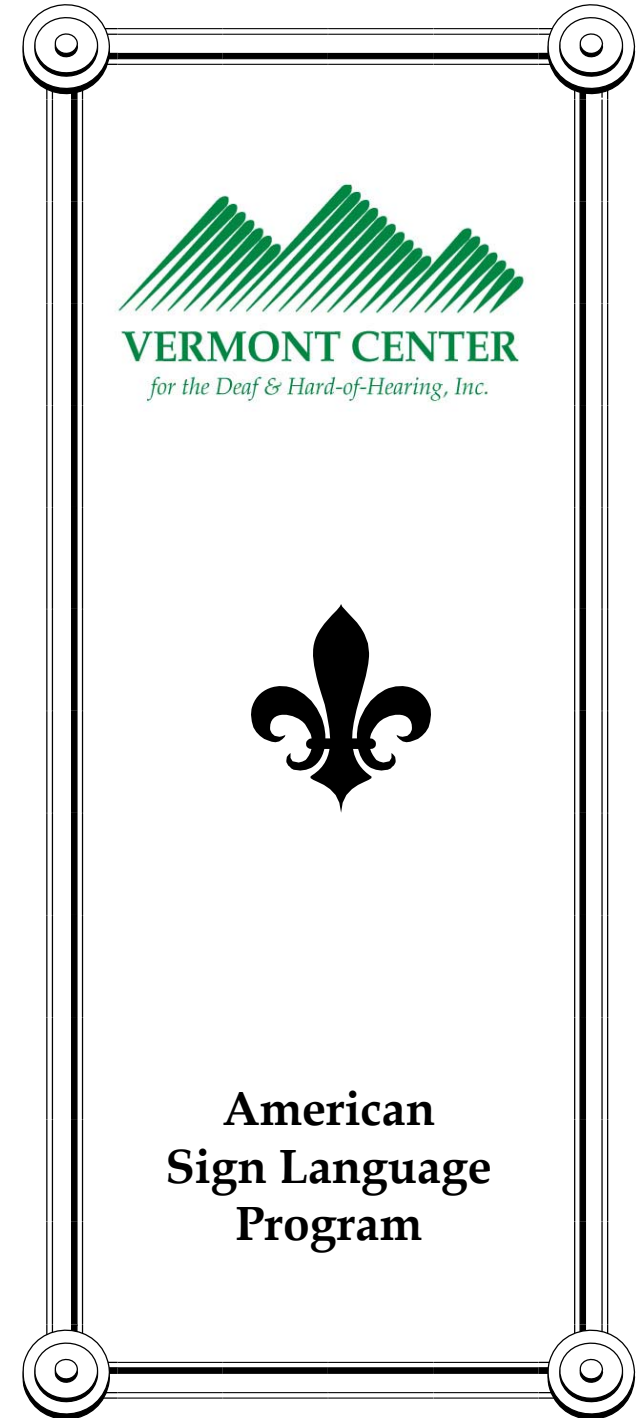

The Vermont Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing is offering a limited number of ASL classes this Spring in the Brattleboro area.

Whether you are interested in learning ASL to become an interpreter, communicate with co-workers, family or friends or simply for pleasure, enroll in one of our beginner classes.

Our instructors use only American Sign Language. This allows you to be fully immersed in an interactive, natural language-learning environment.

ASL I utilizes the VISTA Signing Naturally curriculum provided in the Workbook/DVDs. This class will focus on Units 1 through 3. (13 Weeks)

ASL II utilizes the VISTA Signing Naturally curriculum provided in the Workbook/DVDs, focusing on Units 4 through 6. (13 Weeks)

ASL I & II offer an introduction to learning and understanding ASL; students will also be exposed to cultural values and rules of behavior of the Deaf community in the United States. These classes include receptive and expressive readiness activities, sign vocabulary and grammatical structure.

ASL III utilizes the VISTA Signing Naturally curriculum provided in their Workbook/DVD. These classes will focus on Units 7 – 12, continuing the instruction of ASL utilizing receptive and expressive activities, sign vocabulary, grammatical structure, cultural behaviors and aspects of Deaf culture. Instruction will include classifiers and hand shapes, one of the most challenging parts of ASL. (13 Weeks)

ASL IV utilizes the VISTA Signing Naturally curriculum provided in the Level 2 Workbook and Video/DVD. Instruction will emphasize the more abstract and challenging conversational skills. (13 Week Course)
